My interdisciplinary research program combines scholarship and methods from complex systems theory, science and technology studies, philosophy, cultural studies, and gender studies. My publications and talks focus on the political, economic, social, technological, legal and environmental (PESTLE) impacts of emerging technology, and span diverse topics, including platformisation, artificial intelligence (AI) and machine learning (ML), value–sensitive design, public policy, cybercrime, feminism, and LGBTQI+ issues. For the past two years, I have been ranked in the top 2% of researchers globally across all fields based on citations of my work (Stanford University Research Rankings 2020, 2021). This top 2% is dominated by medical and scientific researchers, making this a substantial achievement in the humanities. I specialise in designing and convening industry transition, socially responsible innovation, and entrepreneurship courses, and digitalising content for online delivery. Thanks, in part, to my previous, 25–year career in media practice, I have a demonstrated track record of forging strategic collaborations with industry, government, and NGOs in Australia and abroad.


